## **COMPLAINT**

Dear Members of the Electoral Commission:

By this letter ("30 June Complaint Letter"), Garry Kasparov and his ticket submit three complaints (the "Complaints") to the Electoral Commission ("ELE") under Article 3.2 of the provisions governing the ELE in Chapter 8 of the FIDE Statutes ("ELE Statutes"). In relation to Afghanistan and Gabon, the Complaints are also brought on behalf of the Afghanistan National Chess Federation ("ANCF") and Association Pour Le Développement des Echecs au Gabon ("ADEG"), respectively, as well as their rightful Presidents and Delegates (Mahmood Hanif for Afghanistan and BONGO AKANGA DJILA Barthélémy (President) and NDONG BENGONO Patrick (Delegate) for Gabon).

The Complaints are attached hereto and incorporated herein. They relate to the list of Delegates that the FIDE Secretariat published on its website on Monday, 16 June 2014 pursuant to Article

5.A(1) of the Electoral Regulations (“16 June FIDE Delegate List”)<sup>1</sup> and certain associated listings in the directory of member federations on the FIDE website for the relevant member federations. Specifically, the Complaints relate to:

- (1) The Delegate listed for Afghanistan on the 16 June FIDE Delegate List and the associated listing on the directory on the FIDE website for the President and Delegate of Afghanistan (“Afghanistan Complaint”);
- (2) The Delegate listed for the Gabonese Republic on the 16 June FIDE Delegate List and the associated listing on the directory on the FIDE website for the member federation, President and Delegate of Gabon (“Gabon Complaint”); and
- (3) The inclusion of a Delegate for the Netherlands Antilles on the 16 June FIDE Delegate List (“Netherlands Antilles Complaint”).

The 16 June FIDE Delegate List as it will be modified by the ELE and published on FIDE’s website and sent to all member federations on 14 July 2014 (“14 July Delegate List”) will determine who is entitled to vote in the 2014 FIDE Presidential elections (subject to further (re)assignments of proxies and delegation of voting power by federation Delegates to Presidents). Further, the associated listings on the directory on the FIDE website are important because they are relied on to determine, for instance, who can assign a proxy on behalf of a federation. For the federation President, for instance, “the accreditation shall be based on the last reporting by the member federation to FIDE concerning this position” and the FIDE website is customarily relied on for this information. (See Electoral Regulations, Articles 5.A(1) – (10)).

The ELE has jurisdiction over the question who is entitled to vote at the 2014 FIDE elections. Indeed, Article 3.5 of the ELE Statutes provides that “[t]he Commission shall verify who is entitled to vote at FIDE’s quadrennial Presidential elections in accordance with the Electoral Regulations.” In connection with the member-federation Delegates, Article 5.A(3) of the Electoral Regulations provides that “the Electoral Commission shall verify the list of delegates” and “notify the FIDE Secretariat of the final list of delegates in time to allow the FIDE Secretariat to send the list to all member federations, and publish it on its website, at the latest four weeks before the opening session of the General Assembly [*in casu*, on 14 July 2014 by 17:00 h Athens time<sup>2</sup>].” Under Article 5.A(10) of the Electoral Regulations, the ELE has the responsibility to “report on the complete list of those entitled to vote” and the General Assembly “cannot overrule the decisions of the Electoral Commission.”

Under Article 3.2 of the ELE Statutes, “[a]ll complaints arising from FIDE’s quadrennial elections, including but not limited to the ... conduct of the elections, ... must be brought before the ELE.”

Thus, under the plain language of the ELE Statutes, the present Complaints must be brought before the ELE because they (i) relate to who is entitled to vote in the 2014 FIDE elections; and (ii) arise “from FIDE’s quadrennial elections” and the “conduct of the elections” by the FIDE Secretariat, including the publication of the 16 June Delegate List and the associated changes made to the directory of member federations on the FIDE website by the FIDE Secretariat and FIDE’s Executive Director, Nigel Freeman. (ELE Statutes, Articles 3.2 and 3.5).

To fulfill its mandate under Article 3.5 of the ELE Statutes to “verify who is entitled to vote at FIDE’s quadrennial Presidential elections in accordance with the Electoral Regulations,” the ELE has jurisdiction to – and must – determine the following:

- Afghanistan: Who is the Delegate of the ANCF for the 2014 elections?
- Gabon: Does the member federation for Gabon that was admitted to FIDE in 2007 – ADEG – continue to exist and under what name and who is its Delegate for the 2014 elections? The ELE’s jurisdiction in relation to the Gabon Complaint is further discussed in the Gabon Complaint.
- Netherland Antilles: Given the dissolution of the Netherlands Antilles in 2010 and FIDE’s decision at the 2012 General Assembly to follow the International Olympic Committee decisions in respect of the Netherlands Antilles, is the Netherlands Antilles entitled to vote at FIDE’s quadrennial elections?

The ELE is a new body that was created by the revisions to the FIDE Handbook approved at the 2012 General Assembly in Istanbul. Under the previous FIDE Statutes and Electoral Regulations, voting questions such as whether a federation continued to exist could be, and were, decided on the General Assembly floor. Such an approach is no longer an option under the revised FIDE rules because only the ELE can “verify who is entitled to vote at FIDE’s quadrennial Presidential elections in accordance with the Electoral Regulations”<sup>3</sup> and “[t]he General Assembly “cannot overrule the decisions of the Electoral Commission.”<sup>4</sup> Indeed, preventing such lengthy and divisive floor fights and providing certainty as to the final voting lists were the main reasons that the ELE was established and that its decisions were specifically precluded from review by the General Assembly.<sup>5</sup> As the new FIDE rules remove all other recourse on the voting questions that have been raised in the Complaints, the ELE has exclusive and necessary jurisdiction over them, regardless of any collateral questions that might arise and may in due course need to be dealt with by a different body.<sup>6</sup>

The Complaints have been “addressed to the ELE in writing within two weeks following the event which gave rise to the Complaints<sup>7</sup> and have been copied to the Secretariat” (ELE Statutes, Article 3.2.1). Thus, the Complaints have been filed on time and in accordance with the procedural requirements in the ELE Statutes and the ELE has exclusive jurisdiction over them and must decide them.

For the reasons set out above and in the Complaints, we request that the ELE grant the following relief:

Afghanistan Complaint:

1. Declare that Mr. Mahmood HANIF is the President and Delegate of the ACNF and the ACNF’s Delegate for the 2014 elections;
2. Order the FIDE Secretariat to:
  - a. amend the 16 June FIDE Delegate list accordingly;
  - b. amend the federation directory listing for Afghanistan on the FIDE website accordingly;
3. List Mr. Mahmood HANIF as the Delegate for Afghanistan on the 14 July FIDE Delegate List; and
4. Provide any other relief the ELE deems appropriate.

Gabon Complaint:

1. Declare that Mr. Patrick NDGONG BENGONO is the President of the FIDE member federation for Gabon;
2. Declare that Mr. Barthélémy BONGO AKANGA NDJILA is the Delegate of the FIDE member federation for Gabon;
3. Order the FIDE Secretariat to:
  - a. amend the 16 June FIDE Delegate list accordingly;
  - b. amend the federation directory listing for Gabon on the FIDE website accordingly;

vote at FIDE’s quadrennial Presidential elections in accordance with the Electoral Regulations” in accordance with Article 3.5 of the ELE Statutes. To the contrary, determining whether a member federation continues to exist is a question that, if it arises, must be decided by the ELE as part of its mandate under Article 3.5 to verify who is entitled to vote at FIDE’s quadrennial elections.

4. List Mr. Barthélémy BONGO AKANGA NDJILA as the Delegate for Gabon on the 14 July FIDE Delegate List; and
5. Provide any other relief the ELE deems appropriate.

Netherlands Antilles Complaint:

1. Declare that the Netherlands Antilles / Curaçao Chess Federation (FEDAKO) is not entitled to vote at the 2014 FIDE elections.
2. Order the FIDE Secretariat to amend the 16 June FIDE Delegate List accordingly;
3. Exclude the Netherlands Antilles / Curaçao Chess Federation (FEDAKO) from the 14 July FIDE Delegate List; and
4. Provide any other relief the ELE deems appropriate.

Article 3.2.5 of the ELE Statutes requires the ELE to “issue a reasoned decision in English in writing to the complainant within 10 days of its receipt of the complaint.” As this 10-day deadline falls on 10 July 2014, we expect to receive the ELE’s reasoned decisions on the Complaints on or before that day in accordance with Article 3.2.5 of the ELE Statutes.

## FIDE Elections 2014: Time schedule

FIDE would like to inform the national federations of the following time schedule, in accordance with electoral regulations article 5A, regarding delegates and proxies for the FIDE elections 2014 in Tromsø:

- a) By 16 June, FIDE shall send to all member federations, and publish on its website, a complete list of the delegates registered on the FIDE website.
- b) By 7 July (Athens time 17.00), the President of each member federation shall inform the FIDE Secretariat in writing of any changes to be made to the list of delegates.
- c) By 14 July (Athens time 17.00), the FIDE Secretariat shall send the final list of delegates, verified by the Electoral Commission, to all member federations, and publish it on its website.
- d) From 15 July (Athens time 9.00) to 28 July (Athens time 17.00), the President or Delegate of each member federation shall inform the FIDE Secretariat in writing if they assign a proxy to a delegate of another federation (who must be on the list of delegates published in accordance with (c) above). Once assigned, a proxy cannot be revoked. After this deadline, further proxies will not be accepted, except for re-assignments as stated below in (f).
- e) By 4 August (Tromsø time 17.00), the FIDE Secretariat shall send the list of proxies, verified by the Electoral Commission, to all member federations, and publish it on its website.
- f) By 8 August (and Tromsø time 17.00): if (and only if) a delegate has been assigned two or more valid proxies, the delegate can re-assign the valid proxies over the one he is allowed to another delegate federation (who must be on the list of delegates published in accordance with (c) above).
- g) By 9 August (Tromsø time 17.00), FIDE shall publish the complete list of those entitled to vote, verified by the Electoral Commission, on its website.
